Abusive practices can include: the very huge age difference (between 20-70 years), being deceitful about marital status or family status in the U.S., forcing the wives in the U.S. to grant them a legal divorce but remaining culturally married, making sons legally marry the young wives so they can bring them, and sexual exploitation of young people overseas. Abusive international marriages/relationships are a form of domestic violence.
